CHAPEL ANNIVERSARY PROGRAM SET FOR JULY 6

One woman's vision more than a century ago has become a place of worship and spiritual refuge for thousands of people over the years. And next month, St. James will celebrate **Lisette Denison Forth's** dream, and what it has given to each of us. communion vessels, the communion service that was in place in 1868 in the Book of Common Prayer, a wooden cross made by a person who knew Lisette well and, a Bible, also from that period.

So please, step back in time with us at the **10 a.m. July 6 service** as Saint James celebrates the 140th anniversary of the chapel in period style.

To truly get into

the spirit, we're asking everyone to dress in 1860's-type clothing, with hats, gloves and other garb typical of the era when St. James was founded.

Much of the celebration will be focused on the great gift that Lisette Denison Forth, a freed slave, gave to Grosse Ile and the Downriver area when she donated her life's savings to build St. James.

She envisioned the chapel as a place where people from all walks of life could worship God together in the Anglican tradition. And today, we do just that. Father Phil plans to use historical



Joyce Turin will give a short history of the chapel during the service, which will be followed by a brunch and games on the lawn.



Hartley Wood Treatment 1/3 part turpentine 1/3 part vinegar (either white or apple) 1/3 part boiled linseed

Mix together and continue to mix during the treatment as the ingredients separate.

Apply solution with a clean cloth. To avoid drips, slightly squeeze the cloth before rubbing it on the wood.

Wipe off the excess solution with another clean cloth.

Venilate the area.

Step back to enjoy the new found richness of the wood!!

Our most recent turn to cook and set up at Spirit of Hope Soup Kitchen, was on Saturday, May 17. Our small but mighty group, consisting of Greg & Marcie Treadwell-Govert, Dave Rudziensky and his three girls: Julie, Emma & Jenny, Madeleine Jones, Frank and me; met downtown at 9 a.m.. Dear Audrey Lyden met us at Saint James but as it turned out the bread and desserts were not going to arrive until after 11 am, so we asked her to join us another time. We made Hamburger-vegetable stew served over mashed potatoes, a garden salad, rolls, and juice and coffee. We also wiped down the tables, set up the chairs and rolled silverware. Our partner groups: the Korean Presbyterians and the Cornerstone Baptists of Roseville, made the peanut butter & jelly sandwiches and bagged the desserts, since the bread and desserts arrived so late but it all worked out. The cost of the meal, including the security guards, was \$195.80, our $\frac{1}{2}$ being \$97.90. Over 200 people were served.

Our next turn to prepare the meal and set up will be Saturday June 21st. We will leave our Chapel parking lot at 8:20 a.m. and you will be back home before noon.

On Saturday July 19th, Saint James will do the entire day alone, setting up, cooking, serving and cleaning up. You may sign up for one of two shifts: 9a.m - 11:30 a.m., or 11:30 a.m. - 1:45 p.m., or you may want to do the whole day with us. We would like to offer homemade desserts so you could sign up to make cookies, brownies, or sheet cakes.

The Saturday, August 16th Spirit of Hope Soup Kitchen will be done alone by the Cornerstone Baptists of Roseville and the Korean Presbyterians. We will have August off!


